INMATE HANDBOOK: RULES & REGULATIONS

INMATE FINANCIAL OBLIGATION

- * Pursuant to Idaho Code §20-607, each sentenced inmate will be billed \$25.00 per day (up to a maximum of \$500.00 per case) for the costs of confinement. Confinement costs are charged from the moment of booking until the day the inmate is released, and will include any pre-sentence Detention Center time.
- * Inmate will be responsible for reimbursing the County for any medical costs incurred on the inmate's behalf.
- * Failure to pay these charges or to make payment arrangements will result in the inmate being reported to a collection agency. Additional fees for the cost of collections will be charged to the inmate (currently set at 50% of the total owed). Continued failure to pay will result in an adverse credit report being filed against the inmate. Negative balances will carry forward on an inmate's account, and money owed will be collected from an inmate's trust fund.

FAILURE TO RETURN THIS RULE BOOK IN USEABLE CONDITION TO DETENTION CENTER STAFF UPON YOUR RELEASE WILL RESULT IN A \$10.00 CHARGE FROM YOUR ACCOUNT.

MEDICAL AND HEALTH CARE

- * As an inmate of the Blaine County Detention Center, a general health and mental health screening procedure took place at time of booking. This screening procedure detailed your past and present medical, physical, and mental condition, and will be kept in your booking file.
- * You may report illness or a need for medical attention on a medical request form. If you have any questions regarding this form, contact the Detention Center Staff. Upon receipt of the medical request form, the Deputy shall review the request (if no emergency treatment is required), then the Deputy will give the form to the medical staff for evaluation on a sick call day. In life-threatening emergency cases, Detention Center personnel will transport you to the hospital, or they will contact the paramedics for an evaluation and/or transport to the emergency room. Injuries or illnesses that occur between sick call days will be referred to the medical staff on call.
- * You will be provided with medical care to prevent immediate pain, suffering, or health deterioration, as deemed appropriate by the contracted Medical Staff. Those ailments or injuries that are or may be questionable are to be referred to the contracted Physician or designee.
- * Inmates who are incarcerated more than (14) fourteen days in the Blaine County Detention Center may receive a health appraisal. Such appraisal will be performed by the contracted Medical Staff.
- * Blaine County Detention Center will provide sick call during the week and clinic once a week. This will be done by the contracted Medical Staff. Any inmate who wants to report for sick call will have to turn in a Medical Request. Any inmate who wants to go to clinic must put in a request at least 24 hours prior to weekly clinic. You will be charged \$20 to see the Medical Staff.
- * Pursuant to Idaho Code §20-619, non-indigent inmates shall be charged a \$20 administration fee for each medical and dental appointment/visit. This fee will be deducted directly from the inmate's commissary account. Non-indigent inmates will also be charged the actual cost for pharmaceutical prescriptions, and medical/dental bills (inmate is responsible for medical services received while incarcerated). A Notice of Inquiry must be filled-out to determine financial status. Non-indigent inmates will not be allowed commissary purchases, if they have a balance due for prescriptions/medications.

DINING

- * Meals will be served (3) three times a day. You will receive (2) two hot meals and (1) one cold per day (at minimum).
- * You will not barter with food handlers for special and/or additional food.
- * You will not store food in your cell or room, unless it is medically approved or ordered from the commissary.
- * All special diets (religious, medical or vegetarian) will result in a review (for approval) by a doctor or nurse.
- * You will eat your meal in the day room unless restricted to your cell.

COMMISSARY

- * You may be offered commissary once per week.
- * The commissary form will be given to you with your name, booking number, and amount available for you to spend in your trust account showing on the form. Using another inmate's commissary sheet is strictly forbidden.
- * When you receive the form, mark the items that you are requesting (clearly) and sign the form. A Detention Center Staff Member will retrieve the form from you.
- * The commissary items will be delivered when time is available, in most cases, it will be the next day.
- * No bartering or passing of food between inmates and cells (loss of items and 1 to 7 days of restricted privileges, such as T.V., library, commissary, visitation, etc.).
- * All commissary plus issued items must fit and stay in your property box when not in use.
- * Commissary that does not fit in your box will be placed in your property bag in booking and not given to you until the next week on commissary day.

MAIL

- * No letters or notes will be mailed or passed between inmates and or cell blocks of the Blaine County Detention Center or inmates of any other facilities.
- * Outgoing letters must be unsealed and have your booking name, the facility name and address in the upper left hand corner. Mail that does not have this information on it will not be sent. The length, source, and/or volume of mail you may send or receive will not be limited, except where there is clear and convincing evidence to justify the limitation. Such reasons include: public safety, facility order, and/or security. If your mail is limited, you will be notified of the determination and the grounds for such a decision in writing. A copy of this documentation will be kept in your records.

- * Both incoming and outgoing mail may be opened and inspected for contraband, but will not be read or rejected, unless there is reasonable suspicion to believe that such correspondence threatens safety, facility order, security, or is being used in the furtherance of illegal activities, in which case you shall be notified in writing. You may also be disciplined and or charged with a crime.
- * If mail is to be read, it will be done in your presence whenever possible.

- * Incoming mail between yourself and your attorney, the court, public officials and similar persons or entities (whose relationship is recognized by the law as privileged) may only be opened in your presence. The correspondence may be read when there is reasonable suspicion to believe that such correspondence threatens safety, facility order, security, or is being used in the furtherance of illegal activities.
- * Outgoing correspondence from you to your attorney, the court, and government officials may be sealed prior to its delivery to the Detention Center Staff. Outgoing letters to attorneys will not be opened or examined unless there is reasonable suspicion to believe that such correspondence threatens safety, facility order, security, or are being used in the furtherance of illegal activities. If the correspondence is opened and reviewed, it will be done in your presence.
- * You may not order food items through the mail.
- * Indigent inmates will be provided with postage and writing supplies for a maximum of two (one-ounce) non-legal letters per week.
- * Indigent inmates shall receive sufficient postage to allow them to communicate reasonably with their attorney, the court, and government officials.
- * Incoming mail shall be delivered to you within 24 hours of receipt by the Detention Center Staff -- excluding weekends and holidays. Outgoing mail shall be delivered to the postal service daily -- excluding weekends and holidays.

VISITATION

- * Any visitor under 18 years of age must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian.
- * Visiting will be from 900 am to 1115 am 1200 to 545 pm and from 630 pm to 900 pm 7 days a week excluding meal times.
- * You will not be removed from Rec. or programs for your visit. Your visitor will be asked to wait or come back later.
- * Visiting time will be 20 minutes per visit. Each inmate may have 1 visit a day. This allows other inmates a chance for visits during the allotted time. Only 2 visitors are allowed per visit.
- * Out-of-town visits (60 Minutes) may be at any reasonable time but scheduled 24 hours in advance. Out-of-town visitors are people residing 100 miles or more from the facility. Any Deputy may approve an Out-of-town visit. You are allowed 4 Out-of-town visits per month. Proof of residency required.
- * Privileged visits are those from law enforcement officers, clergy, and officers of the court (i.e., probation officers, attorneys, etc.)
- * Visitors violating detention rules or acting disruptively may be restricted from further visits.
- * Your visit may be monitored for safety, security and investigation purposes.
- * Your visit may be terminated if rules are violated.

MONEY / PROPERTY RELEASE

- * You may release all of your property to someone outside the Detention Center. To release your property you must submit an Inmate Request Form stating the items to be released and whom they are to be released to.
- * The person to whom you are releasing your property and/or money must have verifiable identification.
- * There will be no financial transactions between you, another inmate and/or a Detention Center Staff Member AT ANY TIME. Your property will not be released to another inmate or Staff Member.
- * You are not allowed to have any form of money (i.e., cash, coins, checks, or money orders) on you while incarcerated.

- * Property release requires only one "Inmate Request Form" authorizing the release (if the items being released are at the same time to the same person).
- * You may not release items that were made in your cell.

RECREATION - OUTDOOR

- * No inmate will be forced to participate in recreation of any type!
- * Recreation is a minimum of (1) one hour per day for at least (5) five days a week.
- * When you go to recreation you will be fully clothed in your orange Detention Center uniform. Once in recreation you can take off the outer shirt only. You must still wear your t-shirt. There will be no exceptions!
- * You may not bring food items to any inmate activities.
- * You will be permitted to return to your housing unit during the recreation period but may not return to the recreation area.
- * You will be provided access to recreational opportunities including activities such as access to the library, television, cards, board games, etc.
- * You will not be refused access to recreational opportunities unless:
 1. An emergency situation exists -- such as a natural disaster.
 2. Recreation by an individual inmate is denied due to medical or disciplinary restrictions or where recreation by an individual inmate presents a real and immediate danger to the inmate, staff, or to the public's safety.

INMATE TELEPHONE CALLS

- * Phones are available for personal collect and prepaid calls. All inmates are permitted equal access to these phones. The calls are automatically limited to (20) minutes. An inmate will not interfere with another inmate's telephone privileges.
- * You cannot dial directory assistance. If you need a number -- fill out an "Inmate Request Form" and a deputy will look up the number for you.
- * Your telephones may be subject to monitoring. Reasons for monitoring are misuse of telephones, preservation of Detention Center security, and investigations.
- * The only time an inmate will be allowed out of his/her cell to make a phone call with a Blaine County phone is for emergencies (i.e., life or death, court ordered), BPA and counseling calls will be done in the Programs Room, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. -- Monday through Friday,
- * The only messages that will be passed are from attorneys and verified emergencies.

RELIGIOUS SERVICES AND SPIRITUAL COUNSELING

- * Religious services and bible studies are conducted on a regular weekly basis.
- * If you wish to see a Protestant, Catholic or Jewish Chaplain for counseling/consultation, submit an Inmate Request Form. All reasonable efforts will be made to accommodate requests.
- * In the event of a serious illness or death in your family, you may request to see the Chaplain or a religious volunteer. The Detention Center Staff will respond to this type of request as soon as possible.

INMATE LIBRARY SERVICES

- * You may have in your possession a maximum of 3 books, other than those issued by religious or educational programs. All books brought into the Detention Center are considered donations and become property of the Detention Center when you are released, except for educational books. Library will be offered twice a week to all cell blocks. When you are released from custody or leaving the facility, you must return any books belonging to the Detention Center library.

MISCELLANEOUS

- * Bibles, eyeglasses or dentures may be left for you at the control area of our facility.
- * Deposits on your trust account must be in the form of U.S. currency, Debit or Credit cards through the kiosk.
- * Western Union money orders, cashier checks or checks made payable to you from a State or Federal agency can also come through the mail.
- * All hygiene items will be issued by the Detention Center or may be purchased by you from the commissary.

COMMISSION OF CRIMES

- * Violation of any local Ordinance, State or Federal Law may result in confinement at an increased level of security, and/or loss of privileges in accordance with the Detention Center Rules on pages 15-22.
- * Crimes committed by an inmate will be investigated by the Blaine County Sheriff's Office or an outside agency and referred to the County Prosecutor for legal action.
- * Violation of any Detention Center rules or regulations will be considered a breach of trust and could result in forfeiture of privileges.

CONTRABAND

- * Contraband is any unlawful or prohibited item, material or substance of which possession is forbidden by law or Detention Center regulations, and may result in loss of good time and disciplinary action as delineated in the RULES section. Some examples are:
 - A. Unauthorized drugs, tobacco
 - B. Medication distributed by the Detention Center Staff, but not authorized for retention
 - C. Chemical intoxicants
 - D. Liquor
 - E. Extra food items which are not authorized by the Detention Center Staff
 - F. Weapons or items that could be considered a weapon
 - G. Money, checks, or money orders
 - H. Picture frames, headbands, and religious paraphernalia, other than those approved by the Detention Center Staff
 - I. Anything altered from its original purpose.
- * You and your living area, Cells and Cell Block are subject to search at any time for the reason of Detention Center security.
- * Except under direct supervision, you shall not have in your possession any tool or implement.
- * You shall not accumulate cleaning supplies, toilet paper, soap, razors or any other item which is provided by the facility.
- * Under no circumstances will an inmate have in their possession anything that is not authorized by Detention Center Staff.

GENERAL GUIDELINES

- * If there is a fight in your Cell Block immediately bunk up in dorm areas and lock down in cell units.
- * You are responsible for your own behavior and are to be courteous and respectful toward the facility, staff and other inmates at all times.
- * You shall address all Staff Members by either their rank, title or as "Mister, Miss, Mrs. or Deputy".
- * If you feel that you should be moved from your current housing unit for your safety, notify a Deputy immediately.
- * For your safety, all parts of your body should be clear of any doors while they are in motion.
- * You will be dressed in a minimum of a t-shirt and pants when not in the shower or in your bunk area.
- * No inmates allowed on the stairs while a deputy is on the stairs. (Major Rule Violation)
- * No inmates allowed under the stairs.
- * Touching a Deputy on the stairs is a (major rule violation.)
- * No loitering on or around the stairs.
- * No horseplay on or under stairs or railing/stairs.
- * No running up and down stairs.
- * TV Remotes are to remain in the day room on a table.
- * If the TV remote control is abused by any inmate it will be removed and the control deputy will choose which channel you watch.
- * After the evening meal place your cup and spork with your tray at the front of the housing unit, behind the red line. After it is washed it will be returned to you.
- * Intercoms are for emergencies and legitimate needs only. Do not abuse the use of the intercoms.
- * You may only pass the red line at the front of the housing units when a Deputy advises you to do so.
- * Mattresses are to be left on the bunks unless the inmate is being released.
- * You may only change bunks with written permission.
- * You will have all property in your property box unless in use.
- * 10:00 pm is quiet time; lock down; lights out, phones and TV's turned off.
- * Dorms must stay in the bunk area after lights out.
- * When you are called to "roll-up", you will come out of your living area with all of your personal property and all items that were issued to you including your mattress.
- * When leaving your housing unit for Court, you are only allowed to take your bible, legal papers and one religious article.
- * Announcement for meals, medication, clothing exchange etc. will be made by Control. Line up single file behind red line against the wall. Outside recreation, special visitation, programs, etc. line up on red line ready to step out when doors are opened. If not, you will not participate in that activity.
- * When moving away from your cell block keep to the left wall. When moving back to your cell keep to the right wall. You will walk in a single line and be absolutely quiet.
- * NO HORSEPLAY, NO YELLING, NO TALKING TO ANYONE ENCOUNTERED ENROUTE TO YOUR DESTINATION. (This includes hand signals).
- * There will be no deviations from the route. You will not get out of line because you see ANYONE and decide that you want to speak with him/her.
- * Any deviation from established decorum shall be dealt with immediately.

LIVING AREAS

- * Cleaning supplies are provided daily to all inmates so that the occupied cells and rooms can be kept in a neat and hygienic condition at all times. Beds are to be made when not used or occupied.
- * Tampering with cleaning equipment, lights, windows, doors, and/or TV's (other than channel changing and volume control) could result in restrictions for the cell and/or removal of the TV for a period of time.
- * TV viewing times are established by the facility. The volume should be kept at a level so as not to disturb inmates wanting to sleep.
- * Hammocks are prohibited.
- * Strings, pens or any other objects will not be attached to bunks or vents. One item at a time may be placed at the foot area of your bunk to dry, once dry it needs to be removed. Towels, blankets or other items are not to be placed on windows or camera's which obstructs officer's clear view of the area.
- * You will not put photographs, pictures, or markings of any type on the walls, windows, bunks, lights, camera's or doors of your housing area. You may put "Inmate Request Forms" and outgoing mail on top of the visitation station in the dayroom of your cell block.
- * You will not block ventilation openings, lights, windows, etc., in any way.
- * No horseplay on the stairs. You may only walk up and down the stairs. No running. (Minor Rule Violation)
- * You are not permitted to possess instamatic photographs (i.e. Polaroids). You may only possess (10) ten 5 X7 size photographs, no more.
- * You may possess in your cell authorized clothing and personal items approved by the Detention Center Staff that will fit in your property box.
- * You will be supplied with a cup and miscellaneous hygiene supplies (i.e., toothbrush, toothpaste, etc.) that must be stored in your property box.
- * You will not sit on top of the tables.
- * You will not stand on bunks, tables, benches, toilets or chairs.
- * Head counts are done 3 times a day or as required by Detention Center Staff. Control will call into the block for you to "bunk up." Go to your bunk and get on it.
- * **The Hotpot in the dayroom is a privilege for everyone to use.**
- * Except for refilling and cleaning, it is to remain in the dayroom at its location and not be placed on the tables or moved to any bunk area.
- * When the hotpot needs refilled, inmates will notify control and request permission to do so. Before refilling, the hotpot must be completely cooled down. It should be rinsed and filled using proper sanitation.

- * **DO NOT ALLOW THE HOTPOT TO RUN OUT OF WATER WHEN IT IS PLUGGED IN. IT MAY BURN OUT THE HEATING ELEMENT.**

- * **Hotpots must be unplugged prior to Lights Out.**

- * **ANY ABUSE OR MISUSE OF THE HOTPOT OR THE HOT WATER IT PRODUCES WILL RESULT IN ITS REMOVAL.**

- * **Toilets are for human waste only. Do not flush clothing, paper towels, pads, tampons, garbage, commissary wrappers etc. down the toilets.**

PERSONAL APPEARANCE AND HYGIENE

- * You will keep your body, hair, and clothing in a neat, clean and odor-free condition. If you are indigent, the facility will provide basic health and comfort items, such as combs, toothbrushes, toothpaste, and bar soap.
- * You will have only 1 set of County issued clothing (uniform), 3 orange t-shirts, 3 orange underwear, 3 orange socks, 1 sweat shirt and 1 bedding set for yourself in your living area at anytime. All inmates will exchange one item for each new item received. Extra clothing will be confiscated and possible disciplinary procedures initiated.
- * You will not wear or possess any type of jewelry except for a Medical Alert necklace or bracelet, wedding band and one religious medallion approved by The Detention Center Staff.
- * You may not wear any types of items in body piercings, including string, paper clips, staples, paper, straw, or plastic. It is considered a health hazard and will subject an inmate to disciplinary action.
- * Prescription sunglasses are authorized if approved by a medical professional.
- * A hair net or cap will only be worn by working inmates handling food. No other type of scarves, handkerchiefs or head bands will be worn.
- * You will be provided with two (2) exchanges of clothing and towels, one (1) exchange of bedding and a sweatshirt per week, and one (1) blanket exchange per month.
- * You will be fully clothed in a Detention Center uniform when you are out of your cell block for any reason.
- * You will wear only County issued clothing except when ordered by the Court to appear in street clothing, or when appearing before a jury.
- * If you are tried before a jury or are ordered to appear in street clothing, clothes can be brought into our facility; however, only one (1) complete set of clothing can be kept in our property area, due to storage limitations -- the new clothing must be exchanged for clothing in your property.
- * You will be offered supplies such as, toothpaste, bar soap, writing materials -- twice a week. You will only receive new items of toothpaste, shampoo, toothbrush, writing materials, etc. if you exchange empty or used items. Razors will be offered daily. Razors will only be left for an appropriate time and will be returned directly to a Deputy.
- * Empty toilet paper rolls will be placed on top of the Video Visitation Station for exchange.

MAJOR VIOLATIONS

PUNISHMENT: 7 to 30 days disciplinary segregation with some restrictions and/or full restriction of inmate privileges, administrative segregation, possible reclassification, possible criminal charges and possible loss of good time.

PUNISHMENT: Written warning up to 7 days Restriction of any or all inmate privileges and possible loss of good time.

- 109 -- ANY WRITTEN FOUL LANGUAGE DIRECTED TOWARD THE STAFF OR OTHER INMATES (INCLUDING GRIEVANCE FORMS)

- 111 -- USE OF UNAUTHORIZED EQUIPMENT

- 112 -- USE OF EQUIPMENT CONTRARY TO INSTRUCTION OF SAFETY STANDARDS

- 114 -- FAILURE TO GET UP WHEN REASONABLY AWAKENED
- 115 -- GAMBLING, PREPARING OR CONDUCTING A GAMBLING POOL OR POSSESSION OF GAMBLING PARAPHERNALIA (EXCEPT PLAYING CARDS)
- 116 -- BEING UNSANITARY OR UNTIDY
- 117 -- HOARDING OF PROPERTY BOXES OR PROPERTY ITEMS
- 118 -- UNAUTHORIZED USE OF MAIL OR PHONE
- 119 -- ATTACHING OR COVERING WALLS, BUNKS, DOORS, WINDOWS, CAMERAS, MIRRORS OR VENTS WITH CLOTHING, TOWELS, TOILET PAPER, PAPER TOWELS, PICTURES OR OTHER ITEMS.
- 120 -- TATTOOING OF SELF OR OTHERS AND ALLOWING TO BE TATOOED WITH PEN, PENCIL OR OTHER INSTRUMENTS
- 121 -- NO PASSING OF ANYTHING BETWEEN INMATES, CELLS OR CELL BLOCKS WILL BE TOLERATED AT ANY TIME
- 122 -- POSSESSION OF ANY ARTICLE MADE FROM THE DESTRUCTION OF COUNTY PROPERTY
- 123 -- SITTING OR STANDING ON TABLES
- 124 -- RUNNING OR HORSEPLAY ON STAIRS OR RAILINGS
- 125 -- BEING LOUD AFTER LIGHTS OUT
- 126-- TAKING MATTRESS OFF BUNKS WITHOUT PERMISSION
- 127-- CROSSING RED LINE IN CELL UNIT WITHOUT PERMISSION
- 128 -- USING INTERCOM EXCESSIVELY
- 129-- CHANGING BUNKS WITHOUT PERMISSION
- 130 -- BEING IMPROPERLY DRESSED
- 131 -- FAILURE TO LOCK DOWN/BUNK UP
- 132 -- NOT WEARING OR DESTRUCTION OF WRISTBAND (\$10 FOR REPLACEMENT)

133 -- VIOLATION OF ANY WRITTEN RULE OR DIRECTIVE

134-- TALKING TO INMATES THROUGH EMERGENCY DOORS OR AIR VENTS

DESTRUCTION OF ANY DETENTION CENTER ITEM WILL BE CHARGED TO YOUR COMMISSARY ACCOUNT FOR REPLACEMENT.

DEFINITIONS

ASSAULT: An unlawful attempt, coupled with apparent ability, to commit a violent injury on the person of another; or an intentional, unlawful threat by word or act to do violence to the person of another, coupled with an apparent ability to do so, and doing some act which creates a well-founded fear in such other person that such violence is imminent.

BATTERY: Willful and unlawful use of force or violence upon the person of another; or actual, intentional and unlawful touching or striking of another person against the will of the other; or unlawfully and intentionally causing bodily harm to an individual.

Restriction: Limitation or deprivation of some privileges

Full Restriction: Limitation or deprivation of all privileges

Disciplinary Detention or Segregation: Segregation with limitation or deprivation of some privileges

Disciplinary Detention (or Segregation) w/full restriction: Segregation with limitation or deprivation of all privileges

Administrative Segregation: A form of separation from the general population when the continued presence of the inmate in the general population would pose a serious threat to life, property, self, staff or other inmates, or to the security or orderly running of the institution.

Privileges: Any item or action that is not listed among inmate rights, such as television, use of telephones, visitation, library privileges, group recreation and worship services, commissary, etc.

Rights: Rights are guaranteed and protected by the Constitution, and include consultation with attorneys, religious practices, medical, dental, and mental care, communication via mail, and the right to be free from abuse, corporal punishment, harassment, and damage of personal property. You have the right to report and file a grievance. Any and all grievances will be promptly investigated and responded to in a fair, impartial and expeditious manner. Any inmate reporting a grievance will not be subject to reprisal by the Detention Center Staff and/or other inmates. You will be provided at least one level of appeal in regards to any decision made on a grievance.

NOTE: When sentenced to another facility or upon release, you, the inmate, will make arrangements for your property to be taken, picked up, or sent (you are responsible for payment), or after 30 days your property will be disposed of. We will hold commissary one week, if not picked up we will dispose of it as we see fit. Your money will not be refunded.

FOREIGN NATIONALS / RESIDENT ALIENS: Inmates, whose citizenship lies outside of the United States, have the right to communicate with their respective consulate. All foreign nationals are entitled to consular notifications and access, regardless of their visa or immigration status in the United States. Upon your request, or if you are a national of a nation requiring mandatory notification, immediate notification will be made to the nearest consul or official of that nation, informing them of your holding / arrest. Additionally, at your request, you may be provided with embassy contact telephone number(s) for future communication.

Bunk up: go to your bunk and get on it. This is used for head counts, if there is a fight anywhere in your cell block, emergencies and for the dorms at lights out.

Lock down: go to your cell and shut the door. This is used if there is a fight anywhere in you cell block, emergencies and lights out at night.
